-Said Donald Trump "doesn't make a thing in America." -

Friday, July 29th, 2016 in a speech at Temple University – FALSE

Many Trump products are made in America including his hats, wine and water. Though photos on the internet circulated of one of his hats having been made in China, PolitiFact found that wasn't true.

- Said unlike Tim Kaine, who "invested" in education, Indiana Gov. Mike Pence "slashed education funding." Hillary Clinton on Saturday, July 23rd, 2016 in a campaign rally in Miami, Fla. FALSE Indiana has not "slashed" education funding under Dana's landarship. In fact, it's been on the pice every
- Pence's leadership. In fact, it's been on the rise every year since Pence took office in 2013.
- Said she "never received nor sent any material that was marked classified" on her private email server while secretary of state. Hillary Clinton on Saturday, July 2nd, 2016 in an interview on MSNBC FALSE
 - FBI findings tear holes in Hillary Clinton's email defense
- "It was allowed," referring to her email practices. Hillary Clinton on Thursday, May 26th, 2016 in an interview on ABC FALSE
 - Hillary Clinton is sticking to her defense that her use of a private email server while secretary of state was "allowed," despite a critical independent audit that found it really wasn't.
- "Let me say that I don't think (Bernie Sanders has) had a single negative ad ever run against him." — Hillary Clinton on Sunday, May 22nd, 2016 in an interview on "Meet the Press" — FALSE
 - Hillary Clinton wrong that no negative ads have hit Bernie Sanders
- "The Clean Power Plan is something that Sen. Sanders has said he would delay implementing." Hillary Clinton on Wednesday, March 9th, 2016 in in the Democratic debate in Florida FALSE
 - Hillary Clinton wrongly says Bernie Sanders wants to

delay the Clean Power Plan

- "You are three times more likely to be able to get a mortgage if you're a white applicant than if you're black or Hispanic, even if you have the same credentials." - Hillary Clinton on Thursday, February 18th, 2016 in an MSNBC-Telemundo town hall - FALSE Hillary Clinton is off-base on comparison of mortgage rejections by race
- "We now have more jobs in solar than we do in oil." Hillary Clinton on Tuesday, December 8th, 2015 in an editorial board interview with the Concord Monitor FALSE

For the oil industry, she didn't look at the whole picture. And self-reported calculations by both the solar and oil and gas industry aren't close. Oil and gas reports 10 times more jobs.

- "I am the only candidate on either side who has laid out a specific plan about what I would do to defeat ISIS." – Hillary Clinton on Wednesday, January 20th, 2016 in a speech in Burlington, Iowa – FALSE We don't see strong evidence for Clinton's claim that she's the only member of the 2016 field with a "specific plan." We rate the claim False.
- "Every piece of legislation, just about, that I ever introduced (in the U.S. Senate) had a Republican cosponsor." Hillary Clinton on Monday, January 18th, 2016 in comments at a campaign organizing event FALSE Her campaign says she meant to cast the statement differently, but we cannot rule based on what candidates intended to say. Clinton introduced a significant amount of legislation without Republican co-sponsors.
- "We now have driven (health care) costs down to the lowest they've been in 50 years." — Hillary Clinton on Sunday, January 17th, 2016 in comments during the South Carolina Democratic presidential debate — FALSE The Clinton campaign acknowledges that the candidate misspoke.

- ISIS is "going to people showing videos of Donald Trump insulting Islam and Muslims in order to recruit more radical jihadists." Hillary Clinton on Saturday, December 19th, 2015 in the Dec. 19 Democratic presidential debate FALSE

 We were unable to find any evidence to support this. The Clinton campaign did not provide any evidence that this is already happening only that it could be happening, or that it may in the future. If ISIS was using Trump
- for recruitment videos, we would expect a frenzy of media coverage over it. We rate this claim False.

 The gun industry is "the only business in America that is wholly protected from any kind of liability." Hillary Clinton on Wednesday, October 7th, 2015 in a town hall-style campaign event in Iowa FALSE
 - Clinton is talking about a law that says the gun industry is protected from liability in certain instances, but the law also specifies several situations in which the gun industry is susceptible to lawsuits. Further, Congress has passed a number of laws that protect a variety of business sectors from lawsuits in certain situations, so the situation is not unique to the gun industry.
- The Benghazi probe is "the longest-running congressional investigation ever." Hillary Clinton on Wednesday, September 30th, 2015 in a campaign Tweet FALSE

 The clearest way to measure this is to look at when a special congressional committee dedicated to a specific investigation officially began and ended. By this measure, this claim is wrong. While the Benghazi investigation has lasted about 17 months, we found other investigations that lasted 30, 40 and even 90 months. And the number of longer investigations only goes up once probes by permanent committees are included. We rate the claim False.
- Says Scott Walker rejected legislation to make college loan payments tax deductible and the result was "to

raise taxes on students." - Hillary Clinton on Tuesday, August 11th, 2015 in a speech - FALSE

The Republican governor hasn't stated support for Democratic-sponsored measures that would have provided the tax deduction, but he has never rejected such legislation, either. Since Walker has been in office, the measures have never been approved by the GOP-controlled Legislature and therefore have never been sent to the governor's desk. Moreover, failing to pass legislation that would have provided a tax deduction doesn't mean that taxes on student loan borrowers were increased. We rate Clinton's statement False.

- **Not one of the 17 GOP candidates has discussed how they'd address the rising cost of college." Hillary Clinton on Sunday, August 23rd, 2015 in a tweet FALSE While some Republican hopefuls haven't had much to say on the issue, it's not accurate to say none of them have. Rubio has made higher education spending a major plank of his campaign, and other candidates like Christie and Fiorina have set forth ideas and positions. Other candidates have at least mentioned the subject at times. We rate Clinton's statement False.
- Hedge fund managers "pay less in taxes than nurses and truck drivers." Hillary Clinton on Monday, May 18th, 2015 in an appearance in Mason City, Iowa FALSE Clinton said that hedge fund managers "pay less in taxes than nurses and truck drivers." She is certainly wrong for dollar amounts, which is what her statement was about. If she meant to say tax rates, that's more complicated, and the data doesn't clearly back up the point. Here, we're looking at just taxes paid, so we rate her claim False.
- Says "all my grandparents" immigrated to America. —
 Hillary Clinton on Wednesday, April 15th, 2015 in a
 roundtable chat in Iowa FALSE
 It's very clear from the evidence that not all of

Hillary Clinton's grandparents were immigrants. In fact,

- only one was. We rate Clinton's statement False.
- "If you are driving on average in America this summer, you'll save according to Department of Energy figures about \$70." Hillary Clinton on Sunday, May 4th, 2008 in Indianapolis FALSE

You only get to \$70 by calculating the savings for a family of four, which has two vehicles. Leaving out that qualifier makes a big difference. In fact, if \$70 is the savings for a family of four with at least two vehicles, it seems likely that the average savings for an individual would be closer to half of \$70 than the \$70 Clinton claims. We rate her statement False.

- "I actually started criticizing the war in Iraq before (Obama) did." Hillary Clinton on Saturday, April 5th, 2008 in Eugene, Ore. FALSE
 - Clinton might be showing moxie by trying to reframe the Iraq issue in a way that puts her on top, but the facts don't support it. On the statement that she criticized the war first after Obama became a senator, the Truth-O-Meter says False.
- "So that 2005 energy bill was a big step backwards on the path to clean, renewable energy. That's why I voted against it." - Hillary Clinton on Tuesday, January 15th, 2008 in debate in Las Vegas - FALSE
 - No, it was a boon to renewable fuel industry. We rate her statement False.
- "It's just outrageous that under President Bush, the National Institutes of Health have been basically decreased in funding." Hillary Clinton on Tuesday, October 30th, 2007 in Philadelphia, Pa. FALSE NIH funding is up under Bush. We rate her statement False.
- English "is our national language...if it becomes official, that means in a place like New York City you can't print ballots in any other language." Hillary Clinton on Sunday, June 3rd, 2007 in New Hampshire. FALSE

An official designation alone would not cancel government programs, and although several pieces of legislation now pending in Congress would repeal some federal mandates on things such as non-English ballots, none of the bills would go so far as to prohibit governments from helping non-English speakers as Clinton said. A 2000 presidential executive order, signed by Bill Clinton, makes it federal policy that multilingual services are considered to be among the rights guaranteed in federal civil rights law. We rate her statement False.
